poverty: the condition of being poor; scarcity, deficiency; below minimum income level needed to get necessities of life.

reduction: the amount by which something is reduced or diminished.

plan: a specific project or definite purpose.

Three simple words.

Yet in Ontario, no political party has put these words together.

Ontario has no plan to reduce poverty.

We can reduce poverty in Ontario – it just takes leadership, commitment and a plan. Good ideas, good intentions—they're a good start but they aren't enough.

Poverty affects us all.

Our target: a 25% reduction in poverty rates in 5 years.

25 in 5: now, that's a plan.

We are calling on all political leaders to tell Ontarians their plan to reduce poverty. We want to hear about goals, targets, time-frames and a way of measuring how we're doing.

It's time to put the words together: Poverty. Reduction. Plan.

We can't afford not to.
